IMPORTANT REMINDERS

PROBATION POLICY

- Attending NESA is a privilege, not a right, and as such it maintains standards in these areas that all students will be expected to meet.
- A student can be put on probation for academic underachievement, poor attendance, or unacceptable behavior.
- Academics: NESA students are expected to maintain passing grades in their core classes and above 80 averages in their NESA classes. Due to the afterschool curricular requirements NESA students have passing classes is mandatory in order to be fully eligible to participate in NESA curriculum. If a student does not meet the expectation of passing all classes and maintaining an 80 in their NESA classes, they will be placed on probation for the nine weeks following the one they failed. Should the student not be able to improve their grades by the end of the probation period, the student can be removed from the NESA program.



- Attendance: Students are expected to meet all State and District attendance requirements. A student should not be absent for 10 or more days in a single semester from any particular class. Should this occur, the student will be placed on probation for the remainder of the school year. If the attendance issue continues, enrollment in the NESA magnet program will be revoked. An unusual extenuating circumstance is a basis for appeal to the director.
- **Behavior:** NESA students are required to adhere to the NEISD code of conduct at all times. The campus administration has the authority to revoke the enrollment of a student during the school year for failure to adhere to school rules; NEISD policies; local, state or federal law.
- Students who receive any alternative placement as a disciplinary measure, including ISS and ISS2, will be placed on probation until the end of the following grading period.
- Students found to be engaging in **bullying** behavior will be put on probation until the end of the following grading period or may be removed from the program.
- Any student action that results in a Disciplinary Alternative Education Placement (DAEP) or long term out of school suspension will result in the immediate removal from the magnet course/program and returned to his/her home campus upon the completion of the DAEP.



SENIOR FEE

- **\$35**
- Will provide students with a senior trip, a graduation stole, and a senior only t-shirt designed by students!
- Senior fees can be paid by check or cash, brought to the NESA office
- Forms will be sent home through their NESA major classes but can also be picked up tonight from the table in the lobby!
